



**A2Z: You began modeling at the early age of fourteen. What inspired you to begin?**

DD: I actually kind of fell into the modeling world. I had a photographer approach me when I was in Junior High School and she set up an appointment for me with the FORD Robert Black Agency in Scottsdale, who offered me a contract. It was a perfect way to make great money and still have flexibility in my schedule to concentrate on school and other activities. I still work with the FORD Robert Black Agency and I'm now with LA Models in Los Angeles.

**A2Z: Did you know that you wanted to make it a career or did it just start out as a pastime?**

DD: Modeling has always been just one facet of my career. Working in the entertainment industry, it's just another piece of who I am. I've been lucky enough to work with some great clients such as Neiman Marcus, Nordstrom, Michael Casey, Nike and many more. But my main focus has always been on television hosting and acting.

**A2Z: You are a talented model, actress, television host, spokeswoman and dancer. What area did you first pursue?**

DD: I began acting, doing commercials, theater, and modeling when I was in Junior High, so I've been working in all of these areas for a while. But dancing was my first love. I started taking ballet and tap when I was only six years old and, later, I continued by dancing professionally with the Arizona Cardinals Cheerleaders. So right after I graduated from ASU I competed for my first time and was lucky enough to win Miss Arizona USA 2004 along with every preliminary competition.

**A2Z: Where did you get to travel to during the Miss Arizona USA and Miss USA pageant?**

DD: During my time as Miss Arizona USA I made appearances all over the state of Arizona at charity events, elementary schools doing TV interviews and also traveled to other places around the country. It premieres on Monday, April 17 on GSN. I also recently completed work on my first feature film called Tranced. It's a comedy that will be released in June 2006.

DD: My personal style is very simple: jeans and a T-shirt. I am usually working and have a stylist dressing me and doing my makeup, so I cherish my free time when I'm in my favorite pair of jeans and a comfy T-shirt.
